Efforts in streamlining Finance

Since the late nineties, efforts were made to streamline the finances of

AAC. The guiding principles of the administration were:

Augmentation of the various sources of income;

Optimum utilization of the available resources;

Professional approach to fund management;

Putting an end to unplanned, ad hoc expenditure;

Striving seriously to stop leakages;

Joint Management of Financial decision;

Building up of corpus Fund

All these attempts resulted in some savings for the college and a portion of the money saved was invested into infrastructural development. The college was able to provide some salary increment to the management staff. This approach to financial management received another momentum when the Province introduced the Campus Treasurer system of the Province.

The Master Plan Committee submitted the summary of the report on July 31, 2013, on the Feast Day of St Ignatius of Loyola. The Management discussed and deliberated on the summary of the Master Plan and came out with the following plan for the next FIVE YEARS.

1. CURRICULUM

There is overall happiness over the existence of various courses offered by the college. Newer responsibilities are added to the college management by introducing courses in English Literature (SF), Mathematics (SF), and Food Science Technology (UGC Sponsored) in the UG section and courses in Physics (SF) and Mathematics (SF) in the PG section.

Accepting the recommendations of the Master Plan Committee the following UG & M.Phil. Courses are scheduled to be introduced in the academic year 2015-2016:

- BSc Visual Communication;
- M Phil Mathematics;
- M Phil Physics

The Jesuit management seeks to inculcate innovations in all its aided

and Self Finance courses by resorting to a thorough revision of the curriculum of every course keeping in mind the twin focus:

empowerment and employability.

The Bridge Course, a semester-long one credit compulsory English course for all first year UG students though appreciated, needs to be strengthened with a new syllabi and methodology of teaching with expertise in the ELT field. Fr Godwin Rufus and Dr Sr Lowrencia are assigned to work out a fresh modus operandi of the Bridge Course from the Academic year 2014-15. It is contemplated to offer a similar Bridge Course to our PG students.

2. TEACHING AND LEARNING

The Madurai Jesuit Curia has set up a Province Planning Team to take care of the planning for the next ten years and a lot of thrusts has been set on Secondary and Higher education sector. A Team consisting of Frs. Christie (Convenor), Joseph Xavier, Mariadoss and Godwin Rufus has been appointed to take care of the formation of the teachers. This team with the help of the Higher Education Coordinator has come out with a new plan that will be implemented in all Jesuit Colleges of Tamil Nadu.

1. A Ten-Day Orientation Programme for all Future Leaders of the College (10 Years of Experience and all the Jesuit young priests in teaching should attend)

Place: Loyola College, Chennai

Date: 14th to 23rd of October 2013

2. A Ten-Day Orientation Programme for all the Newly Recruited Staff Members (Less than five years of experience)

Place: Loyola College, Chennai

Date: 10th 24th of January 2014

3. Jesuit Teaching Pedagogy (for 7 interested teachers)

Place: ANUGRAHA, Notchiyudaiyappatty, Dindigul

Date: October 25th to November 2nd 2014

Along with these compulsory training programmes, the newly recruited staff will have Orientation Programme on Teaching Skills and Technology twice every year.

The Annual Orientation Programme will continue.

The already existing Feed Back Scheme will be strengthened Online.

3. RESEARCH

Jesuits have increasingly realised the importance attached to research activities in the field of Higher Education. They are aware that they can contribute effectively towards the betterment of the society they live in when people concerned to learn for viewing the world with a critical eye. It is a moment of pride for the college and the management that 90% of our staff members are doctors or pursuing their research. The management motivates them through moral, financial support for their research publications, and the Library services.

The new Research Centre for Physics needs an immediate upgrade of its labs. Management is planning to apply for research grants from national funding agencies. The Journal section of the library is to be strengthened with research journals.

4. EXTENSION

Besides the few villages where AAC is implementing development activities through its extension wings ARISE and RADAR, at least **five** more villages are chosen to become its beneficiaries in the fields of achieving 100% literacy and 100 % health. The Jesuit management

happily sets apart the services of two of its priests (Fr. Basil and Fr. Joseph Mahalingam) and two (of its Priest-) students (Joseph of II BCom and Susai Pragasam II BSc Physics), Some sizeable financial amount is also earmarked towards this noble venture. A survey precedes this effort.

5. STRUCTURED CONSULTANCY

Being situated in a rural area with a larger percentage of our students belonging to first-generation learners, AAC is finding it extremely hard to seek employment for its students in companies located in urban areas. The one obvious way to establish links with these companies is to participate in the consultancy services with the help of the experienced more knowledgeable staff members. This necessitates our making a thorough revision of the syllabi with apt adaptation, not forgetting the vision and the mission of the college.

6. INFRASTRUCTURE

An amount to the tune of Rupees 5 crores has been invested for the development of Infrastructure in the past five years and the management is ready to do a little more for the cause of Higher education and to the service of the rural poor. The following Infrastructural facilities are to be provided in the coming five years.

- a. One more floor over the library;
- b. An addition of at least 30 rooms in the boys' hostel;
- c. A new hostel building constructed in the girls' hostel premises;
- d. A new computer Lab with advanced configuration is to be established.

- e. New software for Library and College Website is to be purchased.
- f. Replenishing of the workers quarters;
- g. A few more houses for the management teaching and non-teaching staff;
- h. A farmhouse for the use of students in the RDS extension at Kannanur Farms.
- i. Tar road to the Jesuit Jubilee Stadium and boys' hostel; and,
- i. Advance Technology & Renovation of the Language Lab
- k. For safety and security of the students and encroachment complete compound walling of the whole campus;

7. STUDENT PROGRESSION

The following will be done on a war-footing to help the student community who are poor and who do not get any concession from the government schemes,

- a. A separate corpus fund to be erected as a CARE FUND for the deserving students;
- b. The staff will be encouraged to contribute a little of their earnings for the service of the student community;
- c. A one rupee-a day scheme will be introduced where a student saves a rupee a day towards the contribution of a student activity;
- d. The sports star concession will be started for the educational needs of the sports persons.

- e. The "Vitamin Pot" will be instituted in the hostel for all the hostel sports persons where very nutritious special food with cereals and egg will be provided free of cost every day;
- f. The midday meal scheme will be merged with the hostel to give the poor students a fine unlimited sumptuous lunch.
- g. The already existing MENTOR CARE will be revised and an extra

 Care for the deserving students will be devised along with the

 Counseling centre of our college and the Claretian Counseling Centre.
- h. We will apply to UGC wherever UGC grants are available. For the other projects, the management has to mobilize funds.

- Start MBA in Rural Management with the collaboration of LIBA & XLRI;
- Ensure team spirit;
- Work out Campus planning and implement stability check-up of The existing structures with the help of a professional Architect;
- Make the Department of Rural Development Science a model department linking other institutions and agencies;
- Strengthen the existing Extension Programmes (RADAR, ARISE, NSS, NCC, YRC, etc) and make AAC a partner in the development of the neighbourhood
- Attend to the needs of the Labs, staff rooms, classrooms and Hostel power room facilities immediately;
- Initiate efforts to obtain land from St Mary's with the view to starting commercial ventures and MBA programmes;
- Explore the possibility of finding short term loan for poor students through banks as a stop-gap arrangement until the government releases scholarship
- Maintain the Rural focus of the college and take extra care to resist all temptations to imitate other colleges;
- Keep the proposed Master plan in a prominent place; and,
- Appoint a committee consisting of Jesuit and lay staff to oversee implementation process

Recommendations to the Province

- Continue to offer timely and praiseworthy offer to keep always AAC a self-sufficient institution;
- As per the master plan, the college would require for the next two Years Rs.1,50,00,000/-; and about Rs 50,00,000/- annually for the next three years. Thus, it works out to a total of Rs 4,50,00,000/- in the next five years to make AAC self-sufficient.
- AAC will redouble its efforts to build up a corpus of two and a half crores from various sources;
- The Province may please find out the possibility of offering extending three acres of land to AAC from Melamadai

- AAC appreciates the efforts of the HE Commission for its important role in addressing the needs of AAC; and
- * AAC requests the HE Commission to work out the possibilities of procuring financial help from outside sources including other Jesuit colleges; to share its physical and Human resources with AAC

OBSERVATIONS OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION

Policy on Resource Sharing:

Fr Rector presented an Interim Report of the Resource Sharing Team for AAC. The following comments and views were expressed by the members:

- 1. On the whole, the report was accepted and there was a firm resolve to implement the proposal.
- 2. Members felt that in the context of the Chennai Region, the Province may have difficulty in finding resources to help AAC.
- 3. The majority of the members were for an introduction of additional tax through which the required money could be raised. It was recommended that Revisor could recommend the share of each college.
- 4. The AAC management should be clear about the essential needs of the institution and the non-essential needs.
- 5. Province and other institutions could help with the essential needs.
- 6. Money should be raised and routed through the Province.

- 7. We should be told how the money collected from us by way of tax, is spent or allocated.
- 8. The projected income from twinning with Pondicherry University should find reflected in the financial planning for future-the income projected is so is somewhat on the lower side.
- 9. Close down unviable courses
- 10. The rural focus of courses and college should be strengthened
- 11. As XLRI and LIBA are not rural management institutions, expertise and other help should be sought from XIM, Bhubaneswar or Loyola Academy, Hyderabad.
- 12. The Convener, however, clarified that the proposed Institute will be located in Madurai suburbs and not in Karumathur.
